Riddle

Question: Most people know that 44 candles are required for Chanukah: 1+2+3+...+8=36 plus 8 shamashim gives 44 (if you didn't know, look at your box of candles). In theory only, how many candles would be needed if Chanukah were 100 days long?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: The Gemara says that when it comes to the four cups of wine for the Seder and the candles for Chanukah, even an indigent person must beg if necessary to obtain those objects to perform the Mitzvah. What do the four cups of wine and nerot Chanukah have in common that engenders that requirement?

Answer: Pirsumei nisa (publicizing the miracle) of the exodus and of the Hasmonean victory..
