Riddle

Question: There is a positive Rabbinic mitzvah to light candles on the eve of every Yom Kadosh (defined as a day of issur melacha, such as Shabbat and Yom Tov). However, there is one Yom Kadosh for which we light candles with a bracha as a minhag and not a mitzvah. Do you know which one?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: The Torah never uses the term "Simcha" in its descriptions of only one of the three Regalim. Do you know which one, and can you give an explanation as to why?

Answer: The term Simcha is never associated by the Torah with Pesach / Chag HaMatzot. One explanation is that the purpose of the Exodus was the giving of the Torah, and therefore there cannot be true Simcha until Shavuot.
