Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Tosefot R'YD to Taanit 13, based on Tosefta Brachot 3:25, reports on a custom in Israel to merge two of the 19 berachot of Shemoneh Esrai into one, leaving 18 berachot. The two that were merged are very similar in theme. Do you know which two they are?

Answer: The beracha of Boneh Yerushalayim and the beracha for the restoration of the Davidic dynasty (Et tsemach David ...).
