Riddle

Question: Our custom is to add the paragraph "Nachem" to the Mincha Shmoneh Esrei on Tisha B'Av. Why don't we also say it in Shacharit?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Taanit 29a tells us that the Temple began burning late in the afternoon of the ninth of Av and continued burning the entire day of the tenth. Why then do we begin leniencies such as sitting on chairs, putting on Tefillin, etc. specifically in the afternoon of Tisha B'Av?

Answer: The Rav suggested, based on Midrash Eicha, that the burning of the Mikdash was a consolation in the suffering because it indicated that Hashem decided to vent His wrath on "sticks and stones" rather than totally destroy the Jewish People.
