Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Our custom is to add the paragraph "Nachem" to the Mincha Shmoneh Esrei on Tisha B'Av. Why don't we also say it in Shacharit?

Answer: Those who don't say it in Shacharit hold that the morning of Tisha B'Av has the status of a mourner who has "meito mutal l'fanav" (the yet unburied deceased before him), and consolation (which Nachem is) is inappropriate at that time.
