Riddle

Question: With reference to Shabbat and Yom Kippur, the Torah in Emor states "kol melacha lo ta'asu" (23:3 and 23:28, respectively), whereas with respect to all the Chagim, the Torah says "kol melechet avodah lo ta'asu" (23:8,21,25,35). What is the difference between "kol melacha" and "kol melechet avodah"?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Devarim 11:12 says that Hashem watches over Israel "me'reishit shana v'ad acharit shana." Ramban derives from the missing aleph in "me'reishit" the fact that Tishrei is the beginning of the new year (a fact that is not stated explicitly in the Torah). Can you see how he deduces that?

Answer: The word "me'reishit" without an aleph may be scrambled to spell "mi'Tishrei", which means that reishit shana is in Tishrei.
