Riddle

Question: What bracha may only be recited on a Wednesday or a Thursday?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: The Mechaber in Shulchan Aruch describes one particular misdeed with the verse uttered by Cain in B'reisht 4:13 "gadol avoni mi'nsoh" - [the] sin is too great to bear. What is this misdeed that the Mechaber writes is too great to bear?

Answer: On Shabbat and Yom Kippur, all of the 39 melachot are prohibited. During the Chagim, only melachot that involve avodah are prohibited, but those related to ochel nefesh that are not "avodah" are permitted.
