Riddle

Question: Chazal infer from a redundant text in B'reishit that Zilpah and Bilhah were sisters. Who was their father?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: The Torah repeatedly emphasizes that Sarah was 90 years old when she gave birth. There is another woman later on in the Torah who was much older than that when she gave birth, but the Torah never explicitly mentions it. Who is the woman, and how old was she?

Answer: Yocheved was born when Yaakov brought his family to Egypt. The Jews were there for 210 years, and Moshe was 80 years old when they left. Hence, Yocheved was 130 years old when she gave birth to Moshe.
