D'var Torah-The Mitzva of Sippur Yitzias Mitzrayim

The Seder night is one of the most anxiously awaited nights of the year. Many of us appropriately prepare interesting divrei torah and thought compelling ideas to share with our family and guests, to assure a stimulating and lively Seder. This is, of course, a commendable practice. However in our eagerness to share so much we often neglect the basic elements of the Mitzva of Sippur Yetzias Mitzrayim (retelling the story of the Exodus).

It is reported, in the Sefer Emek Brocha, that Rabbi Chaim Soloveitchik used to begin his Seder each year by explaining to his household the nature of the Mitzva of Sippur Yitzias Mitzrayim, and how this Mitzva differed from the daily Mitzva of Zechiras Yitzias Mitzrayim (Mentioning the miracle of the Exodus). Reb Chaim emphasized three elements of Sippur that contrasted with the Mitzva of Zechira. Unlike the the Mitzva of Zechira, the Mitzvah of Sippur, requires that we a) retell the story of Yitzias Mitzrayim to others, through question and answer; b) that we elongate the story and describe our nations indignations (both the spiritual and physical) - that our forefather Terarch, the father of Avrohom, was an idol worshipper and that our ancestors suffered greatly by being enslaved in Mitzrayim; and c) that we mention and explain the Mitzvahs of Korban Pesach, Matzah and Moror and what they represent. Simply reading the words of the Hagada without understanding them is insufficient.

It is also essential that our children hear the answer to their beautifully recited Ma Nishtana. Once the basics of Sippur Yitzias Mitzrayim have been transmitted, the Seder may be enhanced with the more sophisticated Divrei Torah and ideas. May we all merit a satisfying and meaningful Seder.
