Riddle

Question: There are several explanations as to why we don't make a Birchas She'hechyanu on the counting of the Omer. But some Rishonim suggest that we actually do make that bracha on the Omer. What do you think they are referring to?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Many commentators explain that the reason for counting the Omer is to show our eagerness and anticipation of Shavuot and Matan Torah. Why then don't we count down from 49 to 1, which would indicate how many days remain until Shavuot?

Answer: One answer is that the count must reflect the link between Yetziat Mitzrayim and Matan Torah (Hashem took us out of Egypt so that we could receive the Torah). By counting in ascending order, we realize that the start was at the Exodus and the culmination was at Matan Torah.
