Riddle

Question: Marriages are generally forbidden on Chol HaMoed because the simcha of Yom Tov may not be diminished by "mixing in" the simcha of the wedding. What is the only type of marriage that may be performed on Chol HaMoed? Note: There cannot be any seudah for the marriage.

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: It is not permitted for a "beit din" to be matir (annul) a neder (vow) on Shabbat or Yom Kippur. Why then do we specifically begin Yom Kippur tefillot with Kol Nidre?

Answer: One explanation is that Kol Nidre is not a legal annulment of vows, as Hatarat Nedarim is. We say it to indicate that just as the annulment of vows legally wipes out the vow as if it were never made, so too does Yom Kippur wipe out the sins we may have committed as if they were never done.
