## Riddle

**Question:** Most of us reverse the order of the brachot Shehechyanu and Leishev BaSukka on the second night of Sukkot and say Shehechyanu first since we already said it over the mitzvah of sitting in the Sukka the first night. But since the two days of Yom Tov were ordained because of s'feka d'yoma, and the first day may not have been Yom Tov, why do we assume that the Shehechyanu for the mitzvah of Sukka has already been said?

Last Week's Riddle:

**Question:** Marriages are generally forbidden on Chol HaMoed because the simcha of Yom Tov may not be diminished by "mixing in" the simcha of the wedding. What is the only type of marriage that may be performed on Chol HaMoed? Note: There cannot be any seudah for the marriage.

**Answer:** A divorced couple may remarry on Chol HaMoed. If either divorcee married anyone else after the divorce, then they can never remarry.
