### Riddle

**Question:** The only time we read the Torah in shul at night (after Ma'ariv) is on Simchat Torah. Do you know why we read it then?

Last Week's Riddle:

**Question:** Most of us reverse the order of the brachot Shehechyanu and Leishev BaSukkah on the second night of Sukkot and say Shehechyanu first since we already said it over the mitzvah of sitting in the Sukkah the first night. But since the two days of Yom Tov were ordained because of s'feka d'yoma, and the first day may not have been Yom Tov, why do we assume that the Shehechyanu for the mitzvah of Sukkah has already been said?

**Answer:** Netziv points out that Sukkah is a mitzvah whose preparation (i.e., construction) is written in the Torah ("Chag haSukkos ta'aseh lecha"). As such, one can recite Shehechyanu over the preparation even before the actual mitzvah of sitting in the Sukkah is performed.
