## New Format for Youth Department

We would like to let you know about a change that is happening in the structure of the youth department at our shul. After careful consideration, we believe that for the shul's youth programming to evolve to the next level, the structure needs to be radically rethought. For the youth department to grow, we need to be able to spend on events, prizes, and supplies, so we would like to attempt to have a volunteer-run program, enabling us to put more into the programs and events. We are

tremendously grateful for all of Yehudah Block's dedication over the past two and a half years and we are looking to build off of the foundation he has created.

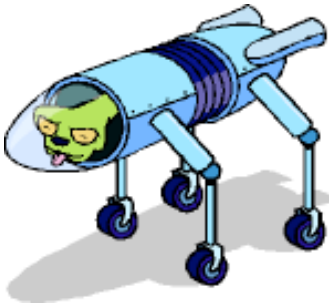
To celebrate our new structure, we are renaming our youth department "Camp Shabbat" to reflect our renewed commitment to the development of the shul as a fun-filled center of our children's religious and social development.



## Changes in the works

Last Sunday we had an open meeting for the community. As it was poorly attended, we are including some of the details of our plans here. We will introduce rotating afternoon groups for the various ages. We are also hoping to add a family seudah shlishit program that will combine divrei torah and zemirot. We are also planning to further develop our Saturday night learning program that is usually run once Shabbat ends early enough.

The structure of Shabbat morning will change a bit as well. The younger groups will have a set schedule and there will be increased parental involvement during the actual groups. The school age groups will have a more defined structure including learning and active game components. Finally, we will be introducing a set of activities for our older kids, including high school students. We know with all change there is a learning curve, but we hope these changes will enhance the Shabbat experience of all of our children.



### Changes to Pre-School Groups

Look for our youngest groups to be infused with life and direction. We will have a structured schedule that allows both the leaders and the children to know what they should be doing at any point in groups. We will weave the stories of the parshat hashavua in

to our weekly games and discussions. We also plan to include more parent involvement in the groups. We are confident that our new hands on approach will make groups richer and more exciting for our youngest group attendees.

### Changes to School-Age Groups

*Groups will have a more set schedule with emphases on tefilah, learning, and fun!*

We will continue to divide groups with the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders together and the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders together. Both groups will start with a junior congregation tefilah experience that combines davening with tefilah related content and an exciting weekly raffle. The

groups will then have different activities in 15 minute increments including snack, learning and games. The 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders will do parsha and have a parsha game each week and the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders will begin learning Pirkei Avot and will have gala siyums at the end of each perek

### Programming for Older Kids

One of the most successful parts of the youth programming has been the creation and endurance of the teen minyan. The minyan is open to all children and their parents but is geared toward 5<sup>th</sup> graders and up. On a typical Shabbat we have nearly 100

people davening together (with almost no talking!). It is a great minyan and we invite everyone to stop by. Building off of this success we will be introducing two new program
