Riddle

Question: Who was the only person who was permitted to enter the Kodesh Kodashim whenever he wanted (albeit with the appropriate ceremonial accoutrements)?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Rav Tzvi Pesach Frank (1873-1961) ruled that women who recite the bracha Shehecheyanu when they light candles for Yom Tov should not answer "amen" when hearing the bracha during Kiddush from the man of the house. Why not?

Answer: Rabbi Frank ruled that to answer "amen" would be a hefsek between the bracha on the wine and the drinking of the wine (answering "amen" to Kiddush is not a hefsek), since the woman had already made the bracha herself.
