Riddle

Question: Poskim point out that just as one must immerse totally in a mikveh to achieve purification, so too one must do teshuva on all aveirot on Yom Kippur to achieve its atonement. What word is used in the Torah both by mikveh and Yom Kippur that leads the Poskim to this conclusion?

Last Week's Riddle:

Question: Who was the only person who was permitted to enter the Kodesh Kodashim whenever he wanted (albeit with the appropriate ceremonial accoutrements)?

Answer: According to the Vilna Gaon, Aharon haKohen could enter the Kodesh Kodashim whenever he wanted, as long as he followed the prescription of the required ceremony in parshat Acharei Mot. That is why, says the Gaon, there is no mention of Yom Kippur until the 29th pasuk of the sedrah.

Rabbi Ephraim Buchwald is one of the leaders in the movement of Jewish return in America today. Ordained at Yeshiva University, where he was a student of Rabbi Dr. J. B. Soloveitchik, Rabbi Buchwald served from 1973 for 15 years as the Director of Education at Lincoln Square Synagogue in New York, which has become one of the largest and most successful centers for adult Jewish education programs in America. He also established and coordinated Lincoln Square's acclaimed outreach program. In July of 1987, Rabbi Buchwald founded the National Jewish Outreach Program. The response to NJOP's campaigns has been historic, and, in 20 years, NJOP has already reached more than 1,120,500 North American Jews in all 50 American states. NJOP programs have also been introduced in 39 countries worldwide. He and his wife Aidel, reside in New York City, and are the proud parents of four children and four grandchildren.
